

PUBLIC NOTICE OF COLIFORM BACTERIA IN DRINKING WATER

City of Pawnee Rock public water supply violated a drinking water microbiological standard for total coliforms in its distribution system in October 2013. Although this is not an emergency, you as customers have a right to know what happened and what is being done to correct the situation.

What happened? We routinely monitor for the presence of total coliform bacteria in our drinking water two times a month. We sampled our water system five times in October 2013 for coliform bacteria. One of the routine samples and one repeat sample showed the presence of total coliform. The standard is that no more than one sample per month may contain coliform.

Who may be at risk and what you should do? **You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective actions.** However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor. People with severely compromised immune systems, infants, and some elderly may be at increased risk. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. This is not an emergency. Total coliform bacteria are generally not harmful themselves. *Coliforms are bacteria which are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially harmful, bacteria may be present. Coliforms were found in more samples than allowed and this was a warning of potential problems.*

No *E. coli* or fecal coliform bacteria have been found in the routine and repeat samples tested this far.

Bacterial contamination can occur when increased run-off enters the drinking water source (for example, following heavy rains)./ It can also happen due to a break in the distribution system (pipes) or a failure in the water treatment process.

What we are doing: Whenever we detect coliform bacteria in any sample, we do follow-up testing to see if other bacteria of greater concern, such as fecal coliform or *E. coli*, are present. We are retesting each positive original site and two sites near each location and may increase the number of routine samples for least the next month. We will also test a sample of untreated (raw) water from each well for *E. coli* bacteria.

Some corrective actions we have taken or are considering include more follow up samples, checking chlorine residuals on the distribution system, flushing lines if needed, making any needed repairs to the system, and continuing investigation until we find the source of contamination. **We anticipate resolving the problem within 14 days.**
