**ORDINANCE NO. 319**

**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING SEWER RATES; AMENDING SECTIONS OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY WITH RESPECT TO INCREASED SEWER RATES.**

*BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the City of Pawnee Rock, Kansas:*

SECTION 1: Section 15-405 of the Revised Code of the City of Pawnee Rock is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 15-405. COSTS. All costs and expense incident to the installation and connection of the building sewer shall be paid by the owner. The owner shall indemnify the city from any loss or damage that may directly or indirectly be occasioned by the installation of the building sewer.
- (a) A service charge of ~~\$18.00~~ \$28.00 per month shall be paid to the City of Pawnee Rock, Kansas, by all persons, firms, corporations, City Departments, the United States, the State of Kansas and its political subdivisions, and any organizations whose premises are connected to the sanitary sewer system of the City of Pawnee Rock, Kansas; that said monthly service charge shall be paid for each such connection if there be more than one on any premises.
- (b) The City Treasurer shall segregate out \$4.50 of said ~~\$12.50~~ \$28.00 received each month from each person or entity connected to or hereafter connected to the sanitary sewer system of the City of Pawnee Rock, Kansas and maintain said funds in a separate line item within the Sewer Fund which may only be expended upon approval of the City Council of the City of Pawnee, Rock, Kansas for the construction or improvement of the water and sewer treatment facilities of the City of Pawnee Rock, Kansas.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper of the City of Pawnee Rock, Kansas.

SECTION 3: Prior section 15-405 is hereby repealed.
